

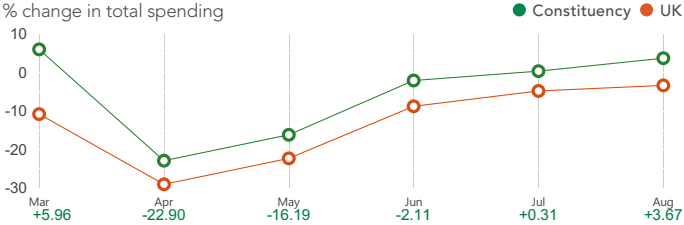
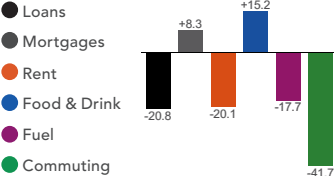


FOYLE NORTHERN IRELAND

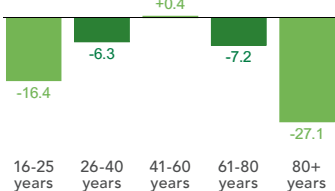

Over the course of the pandemic your constituents' average earnings (calculated from payments made into their personal banking account) were:

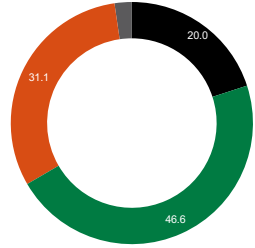
