The boundary for our dominant impacts, such as economic impact, low carbon transition and financial education, is clearly outside our organisation, and principally delivered through our Helping Britain Prosper Plan. We publish our Responsible Business reporting suite annually. It follows the calendar year (noting that our environmental indicators relate to the period 1 October to 30 September) and refers to all of our legal entities. ## Materiality

Our focus on being a responsible, sustainable and diverse business aligns with society's expectations and focuses on areas where we can achieve the greatest positive impact. Engaging with stakeholders enables us to understand what is important to them and help us shape our strategy and reporting.

Our **2019 Materiality Summary** outlines our approach and key material themes and prioritises a set of 'tier one' topics for which we have ambitious goals, and on which we commit to report progress annually. This GRI Index excludes topics that are not formally designated as 'material'. We continue to manage and report on a second set of 'tier two' topics, although the external disclosure is less extensive than for tier one.

An additional third tier of topics continue to be managed and reported, but they are not covered in this GRI Index owing to their level of materiality being below the thresholds used in the formal materiality assessment. Each one is important on its own merits and to specific stakeholders, so information and data on them can be found in our **Reporting Centre**. Further information on human rights, materials, water, energy and waste is also provided for consistency, some of which is externally verified (see Annex at the end of this document).
